The Krishna, Godavari, and Visakhaptnam districts on the east coast were a flood zone before the British built dams to control the floods. It was the original Andhra land. The people who lived in the former flood zone were the DNA J2b, called Andh. Andh lived in Maharashtra. After the dams were built, the DNA H (Teli) people from the Mahanadi River moved in. The current Telugu language is a mixture of only Teli and Andh that evolved only during British rule. The current Andhra Pradesh State was formerly a part of the British Madras Presidency that built the dams.
