

The Agni People, an Archeological View

Originally, the word Agni (Fire) referred to a system of logic, called Fire Logic, also known as “Infer Fire from Smoke:” Where there is Smoke there must be Fire. The people who invented the Fire Logic were known as the Agni.

Idolatry was a Greek invention to rob people. The Greek colonialists in India deliberately misinterpreted the word Agni as a temple god of worship. They employed Brahmin, the unethical Persians, to vandalize all the Agni logic based literature to worship manuals of a fictional God Agni. Before the Greeks, Brahmin did not have God Agni; they had only the Persian gods Shiva, Vishnu, and Indra.

The original Rig Veda (2,000 BCE) was a treatise on the Agni (Fire Logic). The extant Rig Veda was Greek financed Brahmin rubbish, a worship manual of God Agni, devoid of logic and reason. All the other gods of the Rig Veda were Persia gods.


Humans, Homo Sapiens, originated in Africa 200,000 years ago. Some of them, the Asia Clade (DNA C, F), voluntarily migrated out of Ethiopia (Africa) in search of dependable perennial rainwater. At that time, much of the world was covered with glaciers, and the seawater was far below the current levels. The Asia Clade moved from Ethiopia to the current Persian Gulf which was a fertile valley, called Tigris. The C moved on to China, and the F lived in India.

The F was split into subgroups. The J2 lived in the Tigris, the H lived in the Narmada river delta 200 miles west of Mumbai (Bombay) 500 feet below the current sea levels, and the O lived in Balochistan. The J2b (Agni) were a subgroup of the J2.

Twenty thousand years ago, the glaciers started to melt. The Tigris was submerged to form the current Persian Gulf and Gulf of Oman. At that time, there was a giant catch basin around the Mt. Trikuta of the Vindhya with inexhaustible supply of rainwater to feed many rivers. It was the only source of dependable rainwater on the entire subcontinent. The subgroups of F moved to the Trikuta.

The J2 moved to Syria. The J2b (Agni), a subgroup of the J2, moved to the west side of the Trikuta, along the Ken river. The H moved to Trikuta, along the Narmada river. The O moved to the Trikuta, along the Sone river. The J2b, H, and O were relocated to the Trikuta, along different rivers, 20,000 years ago.

Around 2,200 BCE, there was a global drought that lasted for almost 200 years. The Trikuta basin dried out. The F at the Trikuta were forced to move to the east side, the current Bihar and Odisha States. They fused into a new form of culture known as Hindu. The density map shows the new location of the Agni (J2b) after the drought. The white space in the middle was the Trikuta that dried out. All the people were forced to move to the east.



Hindu (J2b, H, O) established a University near the Patna city (Bihar). The original Rig Veda and Bhagavad Gita were books on logic at the University. They were composed around 2,000 BCE, in the language of the Agni called Grandhika.

Sanskrit was invented by the Greeks, as a mixture of Grandhika of Agni and Avestan of Persia Brahmin, to vandalize the Rig Veda and Bhagavad Gita. It did not exist before 200 BCE. It was never a natural dialect of any people. All the books in Sanskrit were recent vandalized versions of Agni Grandhika literature, falsely promoted as of antiquity. The vandalism was financed by the Greeks; it was a State Funded project.

Sun rituals were originally developed by the J2, to keep track of seasons. They were based on Direct Knowledge, sensory Perception.

Agni rituals were a logical extension of Sun rituals. The J2b invented the concept of Inference (Infer Fire from Smoke), a system of logical deduction. Agni rituals were based on Indirect Knowledge, logical Inference.

The Hindu University at Patna invented a new system of logic. They realized that knowledge was both subjective and objective. Subjective knowledge changed from person to person, and reflected bias and prejudices. Objective knowledge must be independent of bias and prejudices; all people, always, must reach the same conclusion.

The Agni at Patna developed a system of reasoning to eliminate Subjective knowledge. If a Proposition (Hypothesis, Adhikarana) were rejected with verifiable facts, then it was Objective Knowledge. It would produce the same predictable outcome every time. An empirically rejected hypothesis was called Sabda, the Objective Knowledge.

Sabda was the equivalent of a present-day controlled experiment, that can be repeated with the same predictable outcome.

The original Rig Veda, composed in Grandhika, was a compilation of Objective Knowledge (Sabda). It was pure logic. The extant Rig Veda, composed in Sanskrit, was Greek rubbish, a worship manual of fictional Zend Avesta gods.

A new system of logic called Sankhya, based on Perception (Direct), Inference (Indirect), and Sabda (Objective) was invented. The original Bhagavad Gita, composed in Grandhika, by professor Vasudeva Krishna, was an exposition of the Sankhya logic. The extant Bhagavad Gita, composed in Sanskrit, is Greek rubbish, invented to promote idolatry.

Using scientific tools, we were able to excavate bits and pieces of the original Grandhika books at the Patna University. Sanskrit had only Grandhika and Avestan. We excavated Grandhika by identifying and discarding Avestan in Sanskrit. Statistical tests revealed that Agni (Grandhika) and Brahmin (Sanskrit) had different metrical styles.

The excavated Grandhika literature has a different story to tell. The Agni invented the Direct, Indirect, and Objective logic. It was the now lost Hindu Scientific Method. The logic of the Grandhika Rig Veda and Bhagavad Gita was the foundation of the modern scientific method of Newton and Einstein called the Logic of Hypothesis Testing.

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
