Hindus (DNA F) are Asian Homo Sapiens. They had nothing to do with the African or European Homo Sapiens. They voluntarily left Somalia 100,000 years ago and followed the monsoon winds from the Arabian Sea to the Bay of Bengal. They lived in the currently submerged Persian Gulf from 80,000 BCE to 10,000 BCE.

Not all of Asia was suitable for human habitation. The land above the treeline (1,000') was not arable. The following map is a digital reconstruction of the landscape to depict the habitable areas; only the areas with the colors light blue, green, yellow, and orange were suitable for habitation. Detailed elevation maps of the monsoon path revealed a fascinating story of the now lost human history. Hindus lived only in the lowlands of perennial rainwater rivers of mountain ridges that were perpendicular to the monsoon winds. They avoided flood basins (flatlands) like the plague. The seawater was far below the current levels; much of their original homeland was submerged by the glacial melt. The maps helped us trace the migration path of Hindus from Somalia to Peninsular India. Unfortunately, the history of Hindus was lost.
