

## The Aravalli Ridge: An Archeological View by Potluri Rao In Seattle ©2018 (CC BY 4.0)

The Asian Homo Sapiens (DNA C and F) left the lowlands of Somalia 100,000 years ago and followed the monsoon winds from the Arabian Sea to the Bay of Bengal. They lived only in the Tropical Zone along the lowlands of the perennial rainwater rivers of the ridges that were perpendicular to the monsoon winds. They had nothing to do with the African or European Homo Sapiens.

When the Europe and India plates collided 25 million years ago, the India Plate was split into the Baloch and Aravalli ridges; the two ridges are still connected at the coast. The area where the Baloch Ridge crashed into the Europe Plate was a gorge called the Baloch Pass. Hindus used the pass to move from the Persian Gulf to the Aravalli Ridge. Both the Baloch and Aravalli are perpendicular to the monsoon winds and trapped rainwater. Asians lived only along the lowlands (green and yellow) of perennial rainwater rivers of the Baloch and Aravalli ridges; they avoided the flatland between the two ridges of the India Plate.
