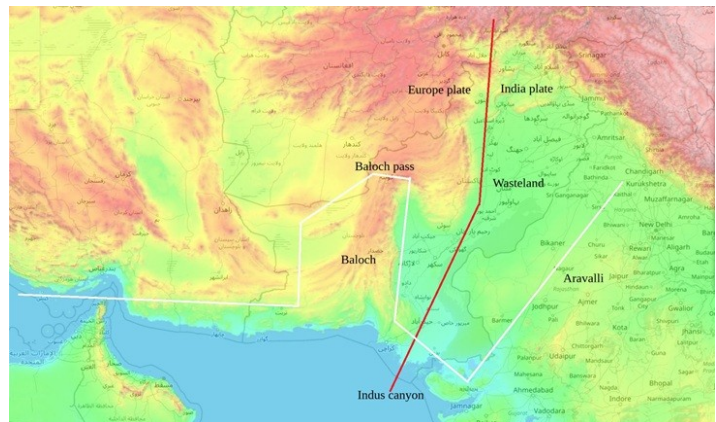


The Baloch Pass: An Archeological View

Hindus, the DNA F, voluntarily moved out of Somalia 100,000 years ago and lived only in the Persian Gulf and Peninsular India. They had nothing to do with the current Africans or Europeans. They were highly advanced logic-based cultures of visionaries, pioneers, and explorers. They followed the monsoon winds from the Arabian Sea to the Bay of Bengal. They lived only along the lowlands of perennial rainwater rivers along the path of the monsoon winds. The Baloch Ridge separated the Gulf from India; it had many rainwater reservoirs that fed rivers on both sides of the ridge. The rivers formed a natural pass to cross the ridge; the rivers are now partially or totally dried out.

The Baloch Pass was formed where the India and Europe plates collided millions of years ago. Originally, the Baloch and Aravalli ridges were one piece on the India plate. When the Europe plate crashed into the India plate, the Baloch and Aravalli ridges were separated. The Baloch moved to the west and pierced into the Europe plate. The area between the two plates was the Baloch Pass.



The monsoon winds blew from the Arabian Sea to the Bay of Bengal. The Baloch and Aravalli ridges were perpendicular to the path of monsoon winds and trapped rainwater. Hindus followed only the path of perennial rainwater rivers. The current Indus River was formed when the Baloch and Aravalli were split by the Europe plate. The canyon was a vast wasteland not suitable for human habitation. Hindus lived only along the ridges with perennial rainwater rivers, not in the wasteland in between.

Hindus never lived along the current Indus or the Himalayas. The people who lived along the current Indus, Pakistan, and the Himalayas were the recent European immigrants (DNA R1) who moved in only 4,000 years ago. They were Sindhus (R1), not Hindus (F). In the recent Greek-financed Sanskrit fictional stories, the warmongering European Sindhus were falsely portrayed as Hindus.
