

Grandhika Ramayana: An Archeological View *by Potluri Rao In Seattle ©2018 (CC BY 4.0)*

The original Ramayana was composed in the Grandhika language by Hindus (DNA J2b) who lived on the west side of the Satpura Range for 20,000 years. When the monsoon winds reversed direction and the west side turned into a wasteland 4,000 years ago, the J2b moved to the east side, to an area called Amarkantak.
