
Amarkantak Pass, an Archeological View

Amarkantak is a mountain pass used by Hindu (DNA J2b) 4,000 years ago to cross the Satpura Range. Today, it is a wild life sanctuary. Indian monsoon winds reverse direction every 20,000 years due to a change in direction of earth's axis. Twenty thousand years ago, monsoon winds blew west to east. The west side of the Satpura called Trikuta was fertile lands, and the east side called Eastern Ghats was wastelands deprived of rainwater. Hindu (DNA J2b, H, O) moved to the Trikuta fertile lands from different directions 20,000 years ago. Four thousand years ago, the monsoon winds reversed direction and blew east to west. The Eastern Ghats turned to fertile lands and the Trikuta turned to wastelands. All the people in the Trikuta were forced to move to the east side.
