The people of the Epic Mahabharata were Sindhu (DNA R1a), not Hindu (DNA F). Hindu lived only in the Peninsular India for 60,000 years. They avoided the Himalayas and the Indus river like the plague. The people who lived at the Indus were the recent Europeans. In their language, Indus was called Sindhu. They were Sindhu, not Hindu.

Four thousand years ago, Eastern Europeans (R1a) moved to the North Bactria, and Central Europeans (R1a1) moved to the South Bactria (Avesta) from Iran. The Z93 were a subgroup of the R1a1.
