

Sanskrit Land: An Archeological View



Sanskrit was a synthetic language with artificial rules of syntax and grammar invented by the Greek colonialists in Kashmir. The Devas (DNA Z93) were a subgroup of Persians (DNA R1a1) who lived in South Bactria (Avesta). They were con artists who worshiped fictional gods Vishnu, Shiva, and Indra. They invented fictional rituals called “Yajna” to market their gods as snake oil. Xerxes, a Persian king, kicked out all the Devas from Avesta to Kashmir. Devas lived only in Kashmir as untouchable refugees.

Idolatry, the worship of idols in temples, was a Greek invention. The Greeks in Kashmir discovered the untouchable Devas and employed them to invent fictional stories of their fictional temple gods. To erase their scandalous past, Devas were renamed as Brahmins with Sanskrit as their language. Temple, Brahmin, and Sanskrit were Greek inventions; they were falsely promoted as being of antiquity.
